


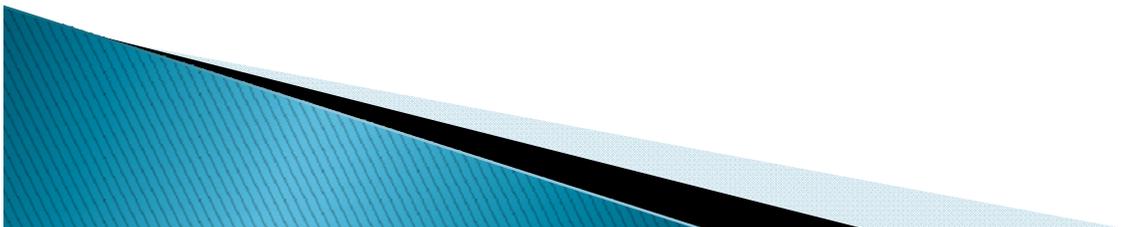


Notice of Grant Award (NOGA) NIH Funding Requirement

“Award recipients are required to comply with the NIH Public Access Policy. This includes submission to PubMed Central (PMC), upon acceptance for publication, an electronic version of a final peer-reviewed, manuscript resulting from research supported in whole or in part, with direct costs from National Institutes of Health.”




What is PubMed Central?

- ▶ PubMed Central is a free digital archive of biomedical and life sciences journal literature at the NIH.
- ▶ Managed by NIH's National Center for Biotechnology Information (NCBI).



When to Submit to PubMed Central?

- ▶ Is the manuscript funded by NIH grant?
- ▶ Does the journal not appear on the list of journals that automatically submit manuscripts to PubMed Central?
- ▶ Is the manuscript to be published after April 7, 2008?



Journals that Submit to PubMed Central Automatically

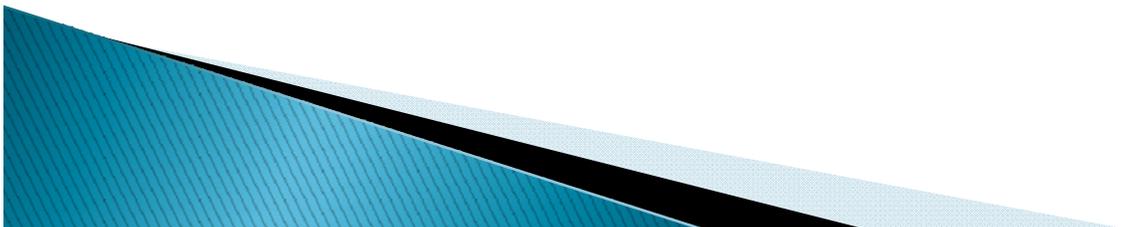

- ▶ If journal is on list then no action needed by authors!
- ▶ May not appear immediately at PubMed Central but must appear no later than 12 months after publication.



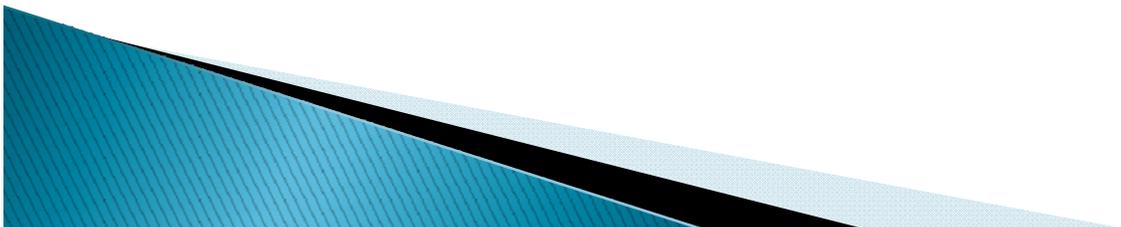
Journal Not On Automatic List

- ▶ First author responsible for submitting via the NIH Manuscript Submission System (NIHMS) <http://www.nihms.nih.gov/>.
- ▶ PI's for grants that funded manuscript also held accountable for failing to meet funding requirements.
- ▶ Must have copyright rights to be able to do so!



Accessing NIHMS

- ▶ Access NIHMS using NIH eRA Commons login.
- ▶ All postdocs must have an eRA Commons username.
- ▶ Can also access using other methods such as MyNCBI login.




What to Submit?

- ▶ Final peer-reviewed version in text form.
- ▶ Upload graphics/figures and supplemental material separately in system.
- ▶ You will need to know your grant number(s).



Copyright – Be Very Careful!


- ▶ When you sign a publisher's copyright agreement you could be signing away your copyright rights.
- ▶ Use Harvard copyright addendum to protect yours and Harvard's interests and ensure you can comply with NIH policy.



Harvard's Copyright Addendum

- ▶ Access via Countway Library website <http://countway.harvard.edu>.
- ▶ Library Services >>> NIH Public Access Policy
- ▶ Harvard addendum protects copyright rights so you can comply with NIH policy.
- ▶ Login to form with your HMS eCommons info.
